Description

A high-density blown glass bottle evoking a figure, with an interlaced pattern of abstract spots; the stopper resembles a head, with the interlaced pattern extending from it. This one-of-a-kind piece, dated 1993, perfectly illustrates the artist's virtuosity. It employs the complex technique of Sommerso, encasing a core of intense shades of fuchsia and amethyst purple within a thick layer of mouth-blown transparent glass. The base features an elegant frosted/satin-finished glass finish, creating a striking contrast with the translucency of the body. Its original sculpted stopper blends harmoniously with the piece as a whole. Signed and dated on the underside of the base.
