



Norman Blown-glass Pitcher With Twisted Ribs And A Blue Band--18th-century Folk Art

Description

A pear-shaped, blown-glass cider pitcher featuring a pattern of evenly spaced twisted ribs; the neck is accented with a cobalt-blue band applied while the glass was still hot. The handle, made of drawn glass and partially hollow, was fused onto the vessel while hot and ends in a button-shaped bend. A trace of the pontil is visible beneath the base. Normandy, second half of the 18th century. Dimensions: height 19.5 cm. The object is in perfect condition. The glass is translucent, with no clouding, cracks, or chips.
