Description

A four-armed bronze bodhisattva with traces of gilding, from Nepal's Kathmandu Valley, dating from the 18th-19th centuries. This sculpture belongs to the Newar tradition of Vajrayana Buddhism. The deity sits on a lotus pedestal separate from the figure. The four arms hold various ritual attributes, including a lamp, a lotus bud, and a flame-shaped emblem. The face, crown, and jewelry contribute to the depiction of a bodhisattva figure. The work is cast in the lost-wax technique from a copper-tin alloy and finished by hand. Traces of fire gilding remain in the protected areas. Condition: signs of age, softened contours, natural oxidation, and partially preserved gilding.
