Carved and gilded wood "francesina" frame.
Venice, 18th century. Sight 51 x 59 cm - Rebate 52.5 x 61 cm - Overall 62 x 70.5 cm. Carved and gilded wood frame of the type known as "francesina". The outer edge is carved with a continuous run of stylised leaf motifs. The main band is carved with four-petalled flowers and foliate scrolls, with elongated plain reserves at the centre of each side. The gilding lies beneath a dark patina, and the gold shows through on the raised areas and the reserves. Condition report: Condition consistent with age, the surface is dulled by a dark patina, with abrasions to the gilding and losses to the gesso ground.
