Victor-Pierre Huguet (1835-1902) Lively Orientalist Landscape Oil on panel, signed lower right 34.5 x 59 cm Victor Pierre Huguet (1835-1902) Born in Le Lude (Sarthe) on May 1, 1835, and died in Paris on August 16, 1902, Victor-Pierre Huguet was a French Orientalist painter. He studied under Émile Loubon at the École des Beaux-Arts in Marseille, then under the Orientalist painter Eugène Fromentin in Paris. While still a teenager, he made his first trip to Egypt in 1852, an experience that had a lasting impact on his inspiration. The following year, he accompanied the marine painter Jean-Baptiste Durand-Brager to Crimea, just before the Siege of Sevastopol. He made his debut at the Salons in Marseille and Paris in 1859, then exhibited "Halte de Bicharis dans le Désert de Lybie" at the Salon

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des Artistes Français in 1861, a notable painting that showcased his talent as a colorist. Beginning in 1893, he presented his works to the Society of French Orientalist Painters. His travels around the Mediterranean--in Algeria, Tunisia, and Turkey--inspired his work, characterized by luminous landscapes, market scenes, and caravans, with a shift toward warm, luminous colors and subtle harmonies of ochres and blues.
