Although in superb condition, these bronzes are authentic 16th century and made from antique models. The left bust is identified: There is Vitellius - Aulus Vitellius Germanicus Imperator Augustus - The quality of the cast (hollow and extremely fine), as well as chasing, stylistic proximity and the visible mounting system to back show that the two works were performed by the same hand. These small bronze statuettes have been a craze in the sixteenth and seventeenth century and became the specialty of the best Northern Italian artists like Riccio, Severo da Ravenna, Guiseppe Levis, Girolamo Campagna and Pietro Tacca. thus

The major international collections such as Fondation Bemberg or the Robert H. Smith Collection have that kind of face assigned to the northern region (Florence, Venice, Padua, Mantua particular) where the patina is observed, font and treatment faces similar to those of our works.
