Description

Rare complete set of 3 bain-marie coffee pots in enameled polychrome earthenware and copper. Beautiful painted decor of musicians putti. The handles are in the form of sirens.

The "pitchers", made of faience with spout, are provided with a handle and a copper lid fixed by two circles of the same metal. The cylindrical lower part fits into a large container which was filled with hot water.

The coffee pots are marked "DAGAND / BREVETE / SGD / DELARUELLE SUCr."

An advertisement published in the Didot Bottin (see photographs) shows the same model by Maison Dagand, manufacturer of coffee makers, located rue Montorgueil in Paris. Provider of the Hotel des Invalides, the Hotel du Louvre, the
