Brascassat (1804-1867) Jacques Raymond
Brascassat (30 August 1804 - 28 February 1867)
was a French painter noted for his landscapes, and
in particular his animal pieces. Brascassat was
born in Bordeaux and studied art in Paris
under Louis Hersent at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts
in Paris. He won second place in the Prix de Rome
of 1825 with a picture of the Hunt of Meleager

He went to Italy and painted a number of
landscapes which were exhibited between 1827
and 1835, but subsequently he devoted
himself mainly to animal-painting, in which his

reputation as an artist was made. His *Bulls fighting* (1837) and his *Cow attacked by Wolves* (1845) are considered some of the best of his pictures. He was known for the accuracy of his observation and his correct drawing. He was elected a member of the Académie française in 1846. He died in Paris in 1867
