PLATE OF BELT FOR REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PEOPLE TO THE ARMIES, REVOLUTION. In molten bronze of rectangular shape, H 10.9 cm, width without curvature 12.5 cm. It represents on a sandy bottom a republic holding in its hands a cluster of lictors and a pike surmounted by the Phrygian cap. In the background are a column, two crossed infantry flags, an oak branch and a laurel branch. Border framing composed of a beaded relief stick. The back is complete with its two side bridges. Very good condition, plate having retained all its gilding, slight leader of crack in high part. La France. Revolution. PROVENANCE: Former collection Bernard Franck.
