Biography

Ernest-Baptiste L  veill   (1841-1913), said Ernest L  veill   is a dealer and editor of bone China and crystals. He founded his company L  veill   in 1869 located at 74 Boulevard Haussmann in Paris, and then acquired in 1885 the house Eug  ne Rousseau, porcelain and crystal dealer and editor. He operated the contents of the Rousseau's studio from 1886 until 1890 under the name "Maison Rousseau et L  veill   r  unies".

L  veill   created models and executed them according to very precise instructions. His cracked and engraved vases on three layers of glass earned him a gold medal. Renamed "E. L  veill  " after the death of Eug  ne Rousseau in 1890, the store was transferred in 1899 to 140 Faubourg Saint-Honor   in Paris. In 1902, Ernest L  veill   joined the company Toy specialized porcelain and crystal wares, under the name "Maisons Toy et L  veill   r  unies". The property was then located at 10 rue de la Paix.
