Gustave de Fraipont, known as Gustave Fraipont, was born in Brussels on May 9, 1849 and he died in Paris on April 29, 1923. He was a painter sculptor, illustrator and French-Belgian poster designer.

He is a pupil of Henri Hendrickx (father of Ernest Hendrickx) and Henri de Hern. Belgian by birth, he was naturalized French. Professor of drawing Dealer

at the House of Education of the Legion of Honor, he is the author of many books on the technique of drawing. In 1885, he provided illustrations for the series "Littoral of Franc" from the publisher Victor Palmé. He also illustrated books about Paris and the French regions.

He published books for the youth such as Andre the miller and Yves the sailor . He also illustrated the Letters of my mill by Daudet, the Tales of Perrault , Robinson Crusoe , Câline de Zenaide Fleuriot .

He produced many posters for railway companies, including the Western and Northern Railways, as well as official documents and paper titles. His poster Pierrefonds, company of the North was reproduced in the magazine Les Maîtres de l'affiche (1895-1900).

He collaborated with numerous newspapers and magazines, such as the Courrier français and Paris illustré. In 1905, he was appointed painter of the Navy.

During the First World War , he made several compositions for the newspaper L'Illustration , including the monuments destroyed by the war: Halls of Ypres , Cathedral of Reims and City Hall Arras.
