Blown opaline goblet with opalescent reflections, decoration of a shaded black basket from which overflows a bouquet of flowers framed by palm leaves with golden foliage and polychrome flowers. Golden edging, slightly worn gilding on the upper edge. Charles X period around 1830 Very good condition Height: 90 mm - Diameter 80 mm In France, the production of opaline begins under the First Empire, around 1810. From 1820, begins the golden age of opaline. The Charles X style allows a return of the curve and a more varied decoration. Glassmakers are becoming more and more skilled in the technique and can thus resort to a palette of colors offering more and more nuances: the soapy opaline, for example, appears around 1822. The opaline is used to produce pieces of crockery for the table
