Paul Audra (1869-1948), although born in Valence, spent most of his career in Nice where he directed the School of Decorative Arts, after having studied in Paris in the famous workshop of Gustave Moreau whose teaching, unlike her colleagues mainly consisted in revealing the style and the talent that her students had in them...

It hadn't gone too badly, since Audra had as a fellow student Matisse, Rouault, Bessy, etc...

"Naked woman with the ball », Red 46 X 30 cm in plain view, under a 65 X 50 cm mat, traces of handling and clear foxing, significant tear at the bottom consolidated. Interesting study showing us the classic profession of the painter, drawing the naked model before putting the clothes on...
