The meeting of Saint Philippe and the eunuch, Saint Philippe teaching the holy scriptures to the eunuch, baptism, then Saint Philippe going up to heaven with the angel. Marteen van Heemsterk was born in Heemsterck in the Netherlands in 1498. His first master is Jan van Scorel from Haarlem, it is there that he acquires his first manner. Then he left to make the trip to Italy from 1532 to 1537

There is an engraving of this painting with nuances in particular clothing which shows that this engraving was made on his return from Italy, because the bodies appear more stripped than in our version, prior to his trip. It was in 1512 that the Sistine Chapel was inaugurated and that we can see everywhere these naked bodies which caused a scandal and changed the vision of human and celestial bodies.
