and was hosted by Jan Brueghel the Elder who
introduced him to his patron, Cardinal Federico

Rubens, starting out as his assistant. Also he collaborated with Jacob Jordaens. He became an accomplished master in well-known works like "The Bear Hunt" at the Kaiser Friedrich Museum in Berlin; "The Fox Hunt" from the Kunsthistorische Museum in Vienna, and "The Deer Hunt" from the Mauritshuis in The Hague. In his brutal hunting scenes, the animals all have personalities.
