## Description

Rare chest of drawers with double central projection in satin wood veneer arranged in leaf in frames, it opens with three rows of drawers without crosspiece on the front, the side panels out, the cut belt, it is adorned with its original gilded bronzes; rings of prints, basins, offcuts, clogs, keyholes, locks present key reported, it is capped with its red marble from the Pyrenees ("great mixture") in the shape and moldings of origin in perfect condition, it rests on four arched legs rounded front uprights, oak fonçures, it is stamped twice with JFDUBUT and JME work from the Transition Louis XV / Louis XVI period in used condition (leaving home; accidents and crimping in the veneer on a side and on the base of the feet) dimensions; Height 86.5cm length (to marble) 111cm width (to marble) 52cm Bibio:
