Ramberg is a painter, draftsman, engraver and illustrator , born in Hanover in 1763 and died in 1840. Noticed by the King of England George III, also Ekector of Hanover, he went to London in 1781, he studied with Benjamin West at the Royal Academie School, in 1782 he began to exhibited at the Royal Academy and in 1784 he obtained a silver medal.He worked there until

At the court of the Elector, he continued to make many portraits for the royal family of England at the same time, he was considered one of the most brilliant draftsmen of his time, illustrating many works or almanacs. He engraved most of his drawings himself.
