Fabius Brest¹, born July 31, 1823 in Marseille and died in the same city on November 5, 1900, is a French orientalist painter. Fabius Brest is a pupil of the painters Émile Loubon in Marseille, and of Constant Troyon in Paris. On the advice of Loubon, who had made a stay in Palestine which had deeply marked him, Fabius Brest made a trip to Turkey from 1855 to 1859, from where he returned with many landscape paintings. The Orient and especially oriental architecture remained his main sources of inspiration throughout his life. Public collections Béziers
