The work of Jean-Baptiste Oudry (1686-1755) was widely disseminated and appreciated in the 18th century. Many engravings or achievements in the decorative arts bear witness to this. The Sèvres factory has taken over Oudry's paintings and engravings for the creation of biscuit statuettes or for painted motifs. Similarly, the goldsmith Jacques Roettiers (1707-1784) created the top-table for Louis de Bourbon-Condé (now
