Uniform bindings of the time in full glazed and havana marbled calfskin, triple cold fillet framing the covers, ribbed spine adorned with cold greasy fillets, boxes and framing boxes in golden dotted lines, large gilded flower decoration, seedlings of flowers and golden dotted lines, vertical gilded serrated fillets, pieces of rust morocco title, golden title, golden volume number, golden tail pallet, speckled edges, golden roulette on the cuts. Rare first edition; complete 8 volumes constituting it (one volume however belongs to the reprint of 1721). Complete set of its 807 boards. Worn angles. Flattened caps can sometimes show small gaps. Back with a slightly altered luster. Slight superficial alterations affecting the dishes; although more marked on one of them. Small lack in the lower margin of the title page of the first volume. Some light rednesses or small spots in the body of books (more pronounced on very rare pages).

Inversion of 12 boards by the binder. Clear outline affecting the bottom of the notebooks of the introductory leaves of the third volume. Iridescence in the first half of the leaves of the fourth volume; of which several plates are separated and of which about twenty notebooks funds also present a gallery of verses (without affecting the illustration or the text). Clear ring on the upper margin of the first leaves of the fifth volume; some boards of which are also unbound. Tiny gallery of verses on the left margin of the last pages of the sixth volume. The whole, however, remains very attractive.
