Signed lower right, with its original frame. 92x65cm Yvonne Mottet, born January 6, 1906 in Lyon, died of a long illness on September 12, 1968 in Saint-Denis-sur-Loire. One of the 5 founding painters of the Man Witness group of 1949. The Man Witness Manifesto: The Man Witness is one of the most important manifestos of the 20th century art. In a world where modern art rhymes with superficiality, egocentricity and progress, the witness man is a cry for a return to the human, to feelings in painting. Eight painters constitute the heart of the witness man: Bernard Buffet, Simone Dat, Michel de Gallard, Bernard Lorjou, André Minaux, Yvonne Mottet, Paul Rebeyrolle and Michel Thompson. The Salon de
