Oleg Teslar is the first husband of Jeannine Guillou who will become the wife of Nicolas de Stael. Jeannine Guillou is herself a painter, five years older than Nicolas. Breton by origin, from a Concarneau family, she has been married for six years to a Pole, Olek Teslar (1900-1952), whom she met at the Decorative Arts in Nice and from whom she has a son, Antek (Antoine) 11 who would later become a writer and screenwriter under the pseudonym Antoine Tudal. The Teslar live in southern Morocco in a sort of phalanstery where they offer medicines to the population. The
