Description

Jean-Paul Van Lith, born in 1940, Contemporary artist, painter, ceramist, master glassmaker, sculptor, designer and French writer, works and lives in Biot. In 1984, the Sèvres museum invited the artist to exhibit his work. Jean Paul Van Lith was promoted to Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres in 1985. Since 1991, his pieces have been exhibited at the Sèvres museum. For years, Jean Paul Van Lith worked on the drafting of the book bringing together all the world knowledge of ceramics: 'Ceramics, encyclopedic dictionary'. He is the author of Fil de fer et ferblanterie, Masques du monde. He has also written numerous articles for the magazines L'Atelier des Métiers d'Art and La Céramique Moderne.
