Jean-Pierre Ceytaire (born May 26, 1946 in Paris) is a French painter, engraver (etching, lithography) and sculptor who has exhibited his works since 1973. After a childhood on the Montmartre hill, Jean-Pierre Ceytaire was, from 1962 to 1965, a student at the Lycée Condorcet. His lack of adherence to the school career leading to his exclusion, he continued at the Danhier School, from 1966 to 1968, studies which resulted in obtaining a diploma in physiotherapy, a profession he would exercise for fifteen years.

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He discovered painting during his military service. The second vocation that was then still painting asserted itself with the first personal exhibition of Jean-Pierre Ceytaire in Brussels in 1973. Quickly, he oriented his art towards religious themes and managed to create a personal figurative expression. It was in 1981, after he settled in Carrières-sur-Seine, on the banks of the Seine, and after a brief abstract period, that the series of paintings *The inhabited jacket* and *The uninhabited jacket* marked the return. towards a figuration of its own ("From time to time, the figures are in relief of wood or cardboard, but the technique of painting never detaches itself from perfection"), freely deforming beings and things in a "Greed for physical metamorphoses" and, in the sequel to Egon Schiele, expressing the phantasmic or fetishistic part of the unconscious: "partially surrealist or symbolist spirit figurations, observes Jean-Paul Gavard-Perret, where Ceytaire explores the themes which are dear to him: eroticism, but also the mysteries of the unconscious, the disturbing strangeness of beings such as the reification of the human, the transfiguration of the imaginary and the dream, the transport of love ". In 1986, Jean-Pierre Ceytaire abandoned the profession of physiotherapist in order to devote himself entirely to painting. He has held solo exhibitions since 1973 and group exhibitions since 1983. These have taken place mainly in France, but also in other countries, including Switzerland, Belgium, Germany, Denmark, Russia. and the United States.
