### Description

In the genealogy of the telephone industry, the Industrial Telephone Company became in 1894 the heir to the Telephone Company created in 1880 which became the following year the General Telephone Company (SGT), which operated the town telephone network. French until the nationalization of its telephone network in 1889. It then concentrated on the industrial manufacture of telephone equipment. The assets of the SIT will be taken over by the Compagnie Industrielle des Téléphones - CIT, which became CIT-Alcatel in 1968.

This "The Violin" model dated 1904 is the first telephone to have the "pick up / hang up" function thanks to its mechanism, but also to have an aesthetic shape. The earpiece is a Type 3 receiver manufactured by ADER and has serial
