Jean-François Deninger (known as Denière) (1756-1866), Parisian bronze manufacturer, who created, among other things, the coronation carriage of Charles X. Student of Aimé Chenavard and Henri Labrouste, he succeeded his father at the head of Maison Denière, an important Parisian house of bronzes and goldsmiths, then employing 400 workers, it would be official supplier to Louis-Philippe and the upper bourgeoisie.
