Description

This truncated conical pot, threaded in engraving, with a retracted and turned lid, seems ordinary, but it is hollowed out in a single block of stone known as "serpentine". Separation of tin between the cover and the contents This fine stone, in the 16th and 17th century, had a reputation for changing color on contact with any poison. Here is a text taken from the Encyclopedia, 1751: "Serpentine is found mainly in Zoeblitz in Misnia; this is why it has sometimes been called marmor zoeblicense. The ease with which this stone is cut means that it shaped an infinity of vessels, boxes, writing cases, & c. which are transported very far. It was formerly the prejudice to believe that the serpentine had the virtue of detecting poisons; but no one should be advised to 'experience it "
