Painter of animated landscapes, landscapes, urban landscapes, seascapes. Amédée Rosier is best known and sought after for his navies. He has a classic touch which nevertheless makes his works very beautiful.

The primary quality of his paintings is light. The painter wonderfully manages to convey the atmosphere of the end of days, when the rays of the sun brush the sea or the intensity of moonlight.
