CHAMPETRE SCENE Original drawing in wash by Louis Aimé GROSCLAUDE (1784 / 86-1869) Louis-Aimé Grosclaude, born in Le Locle (Canton of Neuchâtel) on September 26, 1784 or 1786, died in Paris on December 11, 1869, is a Swiss painter. He is the father of the painter Louis-Frédéric Grosclaude, a pupil of his father, born in Geneva. Louis-Aimé Grosclaude entered the studio of Jean-Baptiste Regnault in 1805 and attended the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris. he did not exhibit at the Paris Salon from 1827. He was the teacher of Fritz Zuber-Buhler when the latter moved to Paris. He painted two works for Baron James de Rothschild. Grosclaude is a member of the Royal Academy of Berlin. His painting met with ardent admirers in Prussia, in particular the King of Prussia. *** Dimensions 17.5 x 23 cm
