



## Mirror With Parecloses In Gilded Wood, France, Early 18th Century



## Description

Gilded wood, mercury mirrors France (Probably South of France, Provence) circa 1710-1730 Good condition, normal wear, original mirrors and gilding (cleaned in our workshops), a broken mirror. Dim: Height: 197 cm, width: 101 cm Elegant Régence period mirror in carved and gilded wood, lined with mirrors with bevelled sides; the main rectangular mirror is surmounted by a pyramidal pediment. The main part is delimited by thin, slightly domed rods with a so-called "Berain" decoration where each corner is decorated with acanthus leaves extended by lilies hiding the cutouts of the mirrors in the reserves. The pediment is a set of moldings decorated with garlands of flowers and palms delimiting a central reserve, the top part is adorned with a large jagged shell. The palm

rue de l'Amiral Roussin Paris 75015 decoration and "bérain" baguettes delimit reserves of "mercury" mirrors with bevelled sides. The whole of the woodcarving is unified by a fine repair and an original gilding varying the effects of matt and shine in order to capture the light. Quality object in a very good state of conservation with a certain decorative effect.
