A lover of mathematics, especially arithmetic, and writing, he worked for an influential merchant in Amsterdam. Appreciated for his views of ports and his illustrations of events in the maritime history of the Netherlands, this painter is also known for his descriptions of storms observed on the spot and then transcribed in the studio. He received prestigious commissions and the greatest - the Elector of Saxony, the King of Prussia, Peter the Great, Tsar of Russia - requested his teaching. A passionate and demanding observer of nature, in particular the landscapes of his region, he does not hesitate to embark himself on ships to study
