Description

Sulpice DEBAUVE (1757-1836), a former pharmacist to Louis XVI, founded a chocolate company in 1800 "near rue St Guillaume, ci in front of rue St Dominique n ° 4"; Before having been the Emperor's supplier, the he company supplies queen Marie Antoinette with sweets, fond of her "pistoles", the only remedy for the unpleasant taste of the medicines she had to take. At the restaurant, PERCIER and FONTAINE "the inventors of the art empire" set up the chocolate maker and his nephew, Jean-Baptiste GALLAIS (1787-1838), 30 rue des Saints Pères, where you can still admire the superb windows that have become "historical monuments"; Boasted by BRILLAT SAVARIN, the chocolate of kings makes the company the queen of chocolate factories and with the slogan "UTILE DULCI" it
