Mi-Koto : Wazamono - Cut Test Rating: Chujyosaku. Osafune blades are part of the Sue-Bizen family of blades, early Muromachi. Mi-Koto blade period, ??.

Region of : Chugokutchiho or Chugoku region, central Japan, Okayama Prefecture. Date: 1465 Kansho Era (1460-1466) - Muromachi period

Blacksmith school : Bizen - Location: Chugokutchiho, or Chugoku region, central Japan, Okayama Prefecture. Norimitsu Kansho 6th generation, of his 1st name Saemon (1460-1466) Bizen. Due to the fact that there are blades signed and dated 1477 "Bunmei era" and bearing the mention "forged by Norimitsu at the age of 72 years", there is a theory according to which the Norimitsu of the 5th and 6th generation would be the same blacksmith.
