Description

Cylindrical refreshing bucket with slightly embossed reliefs and polychrome decoration of detached bouquets, gold fillets and wolf teeth. It has two winding handles decorated with combed gold, gold threads on the upper edge and the base, hard Copenhagen porcelain, Mark with three waves in blue Decor called "saxon flowers"

The royal porcelain factory "Royal Copenhagen" is founded in 1775 by the chemist Frantz Heinrich Muller, initially the factory restores and repairs the dishes of the royal family. The manufacturer was also inspired by the crockery exported from China and its blue painted decors, this one very popular at the time, since the blue hand painted decors became the hallmark of Royal Copenhagen it is used in many of its

The manufacturer uses a cobalt blue, the purest blue, called cobalt zinc silicate, it makes it possible to obtain very subtle shades of blue used in particular for the decorations of its great classic, the "Blue flutted" range.
