Large print on black and white silver bromide gelatin paper pasted on cardboard depicting the King of Serbia Pierre I (1844-1921) on horseback in ceremonial dress. the place and the date remain to be identified, Pierre 1st of Serbia made an official visit to France in November 1911, he received the medal of war commander of 1870, a promotion in Saint Cyr was named "Pierre 1st of Serbia".

A similar photo of Peter I of Serbia on the same horse by Chusseau Flaviens * (1866-1928) is in the Musée Nicéphore Niépce, in Chalon sur Saône.

*Charles Chusseau-Flaviens French photographer in activity from 1890 to 1910, is the creator of the first photo agency.

Its founder, Charles Chusseau-Flaviens, was a French photographer active between 1890 and 1910. Based at 46, rue Bayen in Paris, his agency sold and supplied the emerging illustrated press of the time, notably titles such as L'Illustration and The world.

160 photographers from all over the world have contributed to enrich this collection.

The agency disappears during the First World War. The Chusseau-Flaviens collection is kept mainly at the George Eastman House, the D'Orsay museum and the Nicéphore-Niépce museum, which holds around 4,000 press prints from around 40 countries, from the most serious to the most trivial subjects.
