

Sèvres - Round Embossed Fruit Bowl Decorated With Flower Seedlings, Eighteenth Century



Description

Round fruit bowl with embossed decoration in relief of peony petals, polychrome decoration of throws of flowers, blue threads and gold threads. Silver frame from the Keller house, neck brace punch (gross weight 709grammes), Marked with interlaced L, put date X for 1775 and painter's mark.

Sèvres porcelain comes from one of the most important factories in Europe. Founded in 1740, it remains world famous today. The manufacture of Sèvres was developed thanks to the patronage of Louis XV under the influence of Madame de Pompadour. Originally located in Vincennes then moved to Sèvres in 1756, it produced so-called soft porcelain and then hard porcelain following the discovery of a Kaolin deposit near Limoges 550 EUR
