After an initial Cubist work in 1947, he adopted a lyrical style, influenced in particular by Fernand Léger. His work then evolved towards structured compositions in vibrant colors, marked by the appearance of circles. He has been widely exhibited in France and abroad, and his works feature in numerous public collections. An energetic and gestural composition dated 1968. Created in gouache on paper, it features a play of cobalt blue and vermilion red colors--with accents of deep
