Sculpture representing a woman (geisha?) playing the shamisen, a Japanese three-stringed instrument. This instrument appeared in Japan around 1560 and was used in the music of Kabuki dance and Bunraku theater. The sculpture is executed in a realistic style, characteristic of Japanese art of the Meiji period, when artists were inspired by the achievements of European art to represent typical Japanese themes. Unusual mystery and accuracy of representation. Patinated bronze. Genryusai Seiya - Japanese artist known for his many bronze works depicting people and animals. He belonged to the Tokyo School, which was characterized by the pursuit of strong realism and subtle expression, and was inspired by the achievements of European classical art.
