Description

Cute mustard pot from the Louis XV period in sterling silver and cut Crystal with the hallmarks of the city of Paris for the year 1770 -1771 and of the master goldsmith Théodore Joseph Van Cauwenberghe known' as "Vancombent". This goldsmith of Flemish origin remained a journeyman until the age of forty-seven, before obtaining the master's degree which he obtained in 1770. Our mustard pot therefore belongs to the first production of this goldsmith. He will end up having such a large production that in 1786, a considerable theft worth more than 100,000 pounds can take place in his shop. This setback had a negative influence on the business of our goldsmith, because very few pieces are known by his hand which date from after 1786. The mount is in perfect condition and contains a container
