View of the keep of Pierrefonds taken from the courtyard of the castle June 8, 1866 Viollet le Duc architect Engraved by Octave de Rochebrune (1824-1900) on laid paper with watermark in Terre Neuve 1866 Octave de Rochebrune (1824-1900) was a French painter, sculptor and etcher. He did 492 etchings, including etchings of the Château de Blois, the Château de Chambord and the Château de Vitré. Eugène Viollet-le-Duc (1814-1879) was a French architect and author who restored many prominent medieval landmarks in France, including those which had been damaged or abandoned during the French Revolution.His major restoration projects included Notre-Dame
