Description

It was in 1870 that Giulio Monteverde presented his "Young Christopher Columbus" seated on a fitting terminal with the emblem of the Republic of Genoa, the future navigator cast his gaze on the open sea and held a book in his hands. Several large marble copies were commissioned from him and can be seen today in certain public places, including the Boston Museum or the Château Albertis in Genoa. The proposed bronze statue was produced towards the end of the 19th century (old cast iron), the base is in black marble and a counter-pedestal in gilded bronze. Very nice overall appearance, the original orange-brown patina reveals wear consistent with its age. The bronze alone measures 56 cm, the height indicated includes the marble base.
