shepherdess spinning wool

The shepherd seated on a stump at his feet a dog
and a sheep Bucolic subject inspired by the
naturalist movement initiated by JJ Rousseau and
appreciated by Queen Marie Antoinette.

Terre di Lorraini mark stamped in hollow and
initials JG at the tip, mark found on pieces
between 1777 and 1779.

Paul-Louis Cyfflé sculptor and ceramist, founded
the Lunéville factory, he acquired a reputation in
the world of ceramics its name is associated with
the Land of Lorraine. Measurements: H.24cm x L
19.5cm x W 19cm.
