Dimensions of the canvas 22.5 x 37.5 cm Total dimensions, with frame, 34.5 x 39.5 cm Jules-René Hervé was born in 1887 in Langres, in the east of France where he began his artistic studies in courses in the evening then he moved to Paris in 1908 to study at the School of Decorative Arts. He had his first exhibition in 1910 at the Salon des Artistes Français. He was a pupil of Fernand Cormon. After obtaining his teaching diploma, he began to teach. From 1911 to 1943, he taught painting to many generations of young artists. In 1914, he received a first silver medal from the Association of French Artists. In 1925 he was awarded a gold medal at the Salon
