




A Louis Philippe Charles X Style Mantel Clock

Alongside the main figure, a small malachite terrestrial globe rests on an elegant gilt bronze stand, emphasizing the theme of knowledge and cartography or astronomy. Sumptuous Malachite and White Marble Base: The clock rests on a substantial, multi-tiered base crafted primarily from deep green malachite, known for its intense color and intricate veining. A band of white marble separates the two main levels of the base, providing an elegant contrast.

Ornate Gilt Bronzework (Ormolu): The base and clock case feature intricate gilt bronze (ormolu) mounts and decorative accents. The detailing is finely executed, showcasing scrolling acanthus leaves, stylized shells, and foliate motifs that highlight the craftsmanship of the period. The entire piece is supported by finely sculpted gilt bronze feet.
