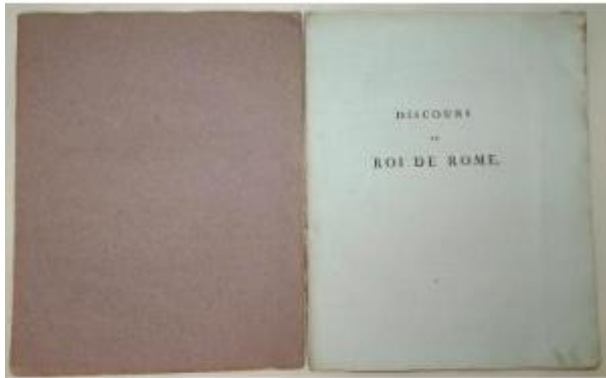

"Speech to the King of Rome" Rare Original edition of this poem written in 1811 by Mr Vigée Louis Guillaume Etienne (born in 1755) for the birth of the Aiglon. Mr. Vigée was secretary to Madame's cabinet before the Revolution and had to undergo a few months of imprisonment during the terror. Napoleon François Charles Joseph (1811-1832) (Napoleon II), only son of Napoleon and Marie Louise, born March 20, 1811 at the Tuilleries Palace, nicknamed l'Aiglon, was King of Rome, Prince Imperial, Prince of Parma and Duke of the Reichstadt.
