Jihada of the type: Itame hada nerete Jinie Tsuku, Itame hada with Jinie Hamon of the type: Chu-Suguha-cho, Midare ha majiru, medium Suguha with Nioi mixed with small Midare, in places large Midare which intersects, we also notice the presence of Sunanagashi Kissaki type: O-kissaki Boshi type: Hakikakete Asaku Kaeru. The green graph on expertise, indicating 6 essential points of expertise, shows a perfect balance between them, for a score equivalent to 9/10, for this blade. Defects: This is an old blade in overall very good condition and has some imperfections due to its age (wear marks and minor scratches).
