Description

Important bronze print with brown patina , representing a "Setter" hunting dog , observing its prey , a rabbit lying under foliage, by sculptor Jules Moigniez (1835-1894) .Jules Moigniez's style is particularly recognizable in the precision he brings to the details of his animal subjects .Bronze signed "J.Moigniez" on the richly chased and ornate naturalistic terrace .Early edition sculpture , second half of the XIXth century .Very good condition and patina .Dimensions : 18 cm x 32 cm x 13.8 cmJules Moigniez (1835-1894)Jules Moigniez is a French animal sculptor .He was a student of Paul Comolera (1818 - 1897) , a great sculptor specializing in birds , himself a student of François Rude .J.Moigniez exhibited his first sculpture "Dog Braque stopping a pheasant" at the age of twenty

at the Universal Exhibition of 1855 in Paris .He then exhibited regularly at the Salon , from 1859 to 1892 , where he obtained an honorable mention in the first year .He presented his sculptures again at the Paris Universal Exhibition in 1878.Jules Moigniez enjoyed great success , particularly in England and the United States . Indeed , his works are considered remarkably detailed , with very thorough carving , complemented by elegance in attitudes .Faced with his son's success,his father created a foundry especially for him .
