Powder pear bearing Masonic symbol, period from 1837 to 1845, for the entry of the state of "Michigan" into the union, symbolized by the 26th star surrounding the radiant sun and the hands entwined with the sign of Masonic recognition. Pear before the Civil War (1861-1865) in the USA. On the top, an eagle behind a shield, perched on arrows and an olive branch. At the bottom, a shield bearing the mention US in its center, on weapon trophies, guns, helmet, flags, instruments. Two triangular-shaped rings (delta) for attaching the hanger of the bulb. The muzzle spring works.
