(old accident at the lower end of the spatula)

Elegant spatula whose handle is carved, at the top, with a wider section animated by a janiform anthropomorphic figure.

The junction with the spatula is made in a linear detachment.

This utilitarian object refers to a common practice among the Melanesians: the chewing of lime. Lime is obtained by burning shells and coral. Its composition is therefore white and powdery. The Dealer
