The handle with its characteristic stepped profile -- the defining motif of the Pyramid collection -- and oval bowl. Length 20 cm. Square Georg Jensen hallmark 1933-1944. The Pyramid collection -- designed by Harald Nielsen from 1927 -- is one of the most celebrated Art Déco creations of Georg Jensen. Nielsen drew inspiration from the treasures of Tutankhamun's tomb, discovered in 1922, to
